Course Description: A field based study which exposes the student to North American church planting through participating in foundational church planting activities in a 10-13 supervised internship with a church plant or a church planting church. 3 semester hrs. Upon request and professor approval.

Course Objectives:

- A. To expose participants to the unchurched / unevangelized people of North America.
- B. To provide a field experience involving current surveying and evangelistic models.
- C. To master required texts and explore church planting / evangelism philosophies.
- D. To observe the church planting process and aid in developing a planting strategy.

Course Requirements:

- A. For each book, write a 1-2 page single-spaced evaluation of major themes (not a summary).
- B. Research (internet, books, etc.) people group dynamics (demographics, history, etc.) of the church plant internship context and/or the intended church plant location. Incorporate research into the reaction paper and record in reading log when possible with bibliography.
- C. Develop at least one goal in the areas of evangelism, discipleship, and leadership.
- D. Journal about weekly activities, insights, and questions and incorporate in reaction paper.
- E. Write a 10-12 page, double spaced, reaction paper incorporating research insights, your church planting experiences, readings from textbooks, and other readings.
- F. Have field supervisor complete the evaluation form.

Grade: Your grade will have four components: (1) Two book evaluations (15% each), (2) Journal and weekly reports (20%), (3) Reaction paper (30%), (4) Supervisor evaluation (20%).
